### January 8, 2006

She also asked for and got confirmation that our March combined meeting with the West Shore Genealogical Society is at our meeting location. Winnie Gould will contact them to make sure they know that.

President Richwine announced a 2-part program on tracing the history of your homestead on Tues., Nov. 14 and Tues., Nov. 21 at 6:30 p.m. at the Fredrickson Library in Camp Hill.
